

Letter from the Chaplain

Make this Door wide enough

One of the unexpected challenges of the last year was to work out how to comply with the Fire Brigade's regulations for a public building. Visitors to the church have got used to the green emergency exit signs. More recently, the wooden panel containing the door from the church into the vestry was removed, remodelled and replaced. We are still waiting for the new wood to be painted; because we are a listed building, this has to be done by experts.

The picture on the right, taken by Diocesan Communications Officer Paul Needle when he was here for last year's Deanery Synod, shows the door before it was widened.

This brings to mind the old prayer by Bishop Thomas Ken (1637-1711), which may be seen on the wall of St Stephen's Church, Wallbrook in London.

O God, make the door of this house wide enough to receive all who need human love and fellowship;


narrow enough to shut out all envy, pride and strife.

Make its threshold **smooth enough** to be no stumbling-block to children, nor to straying feet,

but rugged and strong **enough** to turn back the tempter's power. God make the door of this house

the gateway to thine eternal kingdom.

A wide door means a welcoming building, and a welcoming building needs a welcoming community. This particular door in our church may be more important for going out than for coming in, but our life as a church is also about taking God's love out into the wider community.



This is a prayer of vision, for a church that not only welcomes, but also protects; a church that not only meets people where they are, but points beyond, as a gateway to Christ's kingdom.

I mentioned St Stephen's Church, Walbrook, which is in the city of London. When I looked on the internet for a picture of its doorway, I found instead a picture of a telephone, donated to the church by Post Office Telecommunications to honour the founding of the Samaritans by the Vicar, Chad Varah. As those of you who have lived in England probably know, the Samaritans is a national voluntary organization providing telephone support to those in trouble, especially to those contemplating suicide. The presence of the memorial telephone in the church is a reminder that this electronic age has given

a new meaning to the word 'gateway' - and through this gateway, too, many have found shelter in the storms of their lives, the hospitality of a listening ear, and protection from danger. St Stephen's is a fine building, with many historic monuments; but it is not content to live in the past. Chad Varah brought its mission up to date.

Shortly after the door was replaced, we held our annual meeting. The new door

reminds us of some of the things that have preoccupied and distracted us over the few past years — the difficulty and expense of maintaining our beautiful and historic building to twenty-first century standards. We now need to move on, to ask ourselves, what is the mission of St Andrew's today? What is our vision for the future?

Before the Annual Meeting, members of the congregation were invited to be part of the discussion, by writing their thoughts on a post-it note and sticking it on a notice board under the heading "This is our church." You will find their comments listed and summarized in the centrefold of this magazine. The next stage in the discussion will be after the service on Sunday 10 June. Why not come along and join in?



We are now inviting the congregation to reflect further on this issue and to participate to 'This is Our Church' meeting on 10 June


2012 after the Ham regular service at St Andrew's.

We raised ca. 18.000 kr - Everyone well done. Thank you.


