

Letter from our Chaplain

"O give thanks to the Lord for he is gracious and his Love endures forever" Psalm 136 v1

Sunday the first of September we will gather as we do each Sunday for the Eucharist a word which we use to designate the Holy Communion. It is from two Greek words meaning " to give thanks and praise." Indeed this is the season of the harvest when throughout Christianity we give thanks to God for the gracious gift of his bounty in creation and we are reminded by the psalmist that his love and mercy endures forever.

I was once told that there are two prayers that are essential to say every day. In the morning "Help me" and at the end of the day "Thank You." It is not that all other forms of prayer are non essential but these two simple phrases sum it up. The Lord's Prayer says pretty much the same thing with the phrases, Give us this day...for yours is the Kingdom. To give thanks to God we acknowledge his love for us and we reap a harvest of thanksgiving and the bounty of his goodness.

I knew a person who was chronically ill and felt destitute and abandoned. She wondered what she had to be grateful for and realized that no matter how bad things were she should find something. So she looked at herself and realized that she could move her toes so she gave thanks. She realized she had her sight and hearing so she gave thanks. The more she thought of it she realized that while she had an illness that there was much that was right about her. The



more she gave thanks the more she realized what she had to be grateful for. The good out weighed the bad.

Let us come to this season of Thanksgiving with a spirit ready to harvest all the good in us as God's love is from everlasting to everlasting.

I leave you with this poem by the Russian writer Dostoyevesky:

Love All Creation
The whole of it
And every grain of sand.
Love every leaf,
Every Ray of God's light.
Love the animals, the plants,
love everything.
If you love everything,
you will perceive in all things
The Divine Mystery.

Meet our new Music Director

Patrick George Sonny Holming was born in Harwich, England as the first of three children. His parents, father Hans Uno Holming from Finland and Mother Fay from England, settled however in Sweden and came soon to Gothenburg where Patrick grew up and received his formal education.

When Patrick was 4 years old, his parents bought an upright piano for 500 Swedish

This became one of the peakexperiences of his life... From that moment, this music did not leave him alone... He now wished to have a grand piano. With the aid of the saved children allowance, Patrick got a Yamaha grand piano. Until his 14th year, the young Holming wanted actually to study natural sciences; however, after two trial weeks at a lab, he discarded the idea. He sought out a Swedish pianist of repute: Ingemar Hedvall, and took lessons from him. He also enrolled for music courses that were then offered at the Swedish church and took lessons in organ and music theory, notably from Lars Nordh (Oscar Fredriks Church) and John Lassbo (Carl Johans Church).

He continued his musical studies in Austria where he studied at the University of Music and Dramatic Arts in Graz, studying piano with Chung Lee and Annamaria Bodoky-Krause. He also studied harpsichord, accompaniment and ancient music at the Johann-Josef-Fux-conservatory in Graz with Margret


Bogner. He has participated in several master classes, notably with Robert Riefling and Rudolf Kehrer. His piano teaching (1997) and Masters degrees (1998) were both awarded with distinction by the University of Music and Dramatic Arts in Graz. In Graz, Patrick

Holming was the organist of the Liberal Catholic Church and a substitute organist in Evangelical Churches.

Further, he has taught piano at musicschools in Austria, researched piano performance and lectured various groups of pianists and piano pedagogues. From 2005 till 2016 he taught piano in Bangkok first at Chulalongkorn University and then at College of Music, Mahidol University.

He has performed as a pianist in several countries (e.g. Finland, Croatia, Malta, Austria, Sweden and Thailand).

Currently, Patrick Holming is Director of Music at St Andrew's Church and teaches piano at music schools in Stockholm.
